- AUD** 4.5 hrs Standards, Planning & Evidence, Internal Control, Reports, Compilations & Reviews
- FAR** 4.0 hrs Business Enterprises, Governmental Entities, Not-for-profit Organizations
- REG** 3.0 hrs Taxation, Law & Professional Responsibilities
- BEC** 2.5 hrs Economic Concepts, Financial Management, Information Technology

How do I apply for the exam?

- Send your transcripts to the State Board of Accountancy and other organizations
- Apply to the State Board of Accountancy
- Pay your initial exam application fee

What do I need to sit for the exam?

- Completed Bachelor's Degree in Accounting or equivalent 150 credit hours
- 24 semester units in Accounting classes
- 22 semester units in Business-related subjects

What do I need to gain licensure?

- Pass all 4 parts of the CPA exam.
- Obtain 2 years of experience in public accounting (at least 6 months in Audit) under the supervision of a licensed CPA.
- Meet educational requirements.
- 150 hours (Accounting-36 hours, Economics/Business Administration-30 hours, General Education-60 Hours, Any Subject-24 hours).
- Pass Ethics exam with a 90% or better.

What type of experience do I need?

- All states accept public accounting, many states also accept private and governmental accounting.
- Employer will fill out experience form.
- Can usually be fulfilled before, during or after passing the CPA Exam.
